

2) Dr. W.W. Bartlett Memorial Award (Most Valuable Defensive Player)



Dr. W. W. Bartlett. Dr. W.W. Bartlett, club physician for the Excelsiors for over 40 years, from the mid '30's until his death in 1979, was an ardent supporter of lacrosse in both field and box-lacrosse eras. He played with Brampton and University of Toronto teams from 1927-1930. Prior to qualified trainers being involved in community sports, Dr. Bartlett attended most games, home and away, and would often be found in the dressing rooms taping ankles and wrists etc. prior to games, from early in the schedule until playoff time, including the Canadian championships of the Excelsiors from 1942-1959. He was inducted as a Builder to the Canadian Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 1979.
